Free inquiry is at the core of liberal learning. As a university dedicated to the liberal arts and sciences, Christopher Newport is profoundly committed to the constitutional protection of free speech and expression.

At the direction of Virginia Code §23.1-401.1(D.), this Annual Report on Free Speech is submitted this December 2, 2024. Christopher Newport has developed and published materials and policies regarding constitutionally protected speech under the First Amendment of the United States Constitution. Our Statement on Free Speech and Expression and the process to report incidents of disruption of constitutionally protected speech may be viewed at <a href="http://cnu.edu/public/freespeech/">http://cnu.edu/public/freespeech/</a>. The University's statement on academic freedom and responsibility is included in the University Handbook (<a href="http://cnu.edu/public/handbooks/">http://cnu.edu/public/handbooks/</a>) and students' rights and responsibilities regarding freedom of expression are included in the Student Handbook (<a href="https://cnu.edu/public/studenthandbook/">https://cnu.edu/public/studenthandbook/</a>).

Employees responsible for the discipline or education of enrolled students have been notified of policies and rights stated in the Student Handbook regarding speech that is constitutionally protected under the First Amendment.

There have been no complaints filed in a court of law since December 1, 2023, to initiate a lawsuit against the University or a University employee for an alleged violation of the First Amendment of the United States Constitution.

As President of Christopher Newport University, I hereby affirm that the University has fulfilled the requirements in Virginia Code §23.1-401.1.
